The parent or guardian is responsible for ensuring they receive an email stating that this enrollment application was received. As a secondary confirmation to you, the school will email or call each applicant within two business days of receipt. Please call the school if you don't hear from us within this timeframe.

Your child **must be 5 years of age by August 31, 2021** to be eligible for Kindergarten registration.

If the number of applications for any grade level exceeds the number of openings, the JPTA lottery procedure will follow. Please visit our school website for our Enrollment and Lottery policy.

The Lottery was held March 4th, 2021.

As a result, your child will not be placed through the lottery process. One of the two scenarios apply:

- 1) If there is an open space in the same grade that your child is seeking enrollment and no other individuals are on the waitlist for that open space, your child will be offered that space; or
- 2) If there are already individuals on the waiting list for the grade level that your child is seeking enrollment, your child will be placed in the next waitlist position for that grade level.
